- The program aims to deepen the understanding of food culture in China
- It consists of more than 20 lectures, several tours and visits (including Shanghai), activities with local students, and—of course—many tasty opportunities

Course fee

- About CAD\$3,600 (incl. lectures, excursions, accommodation. Meals and additional expenses are not covered)

Course Offerings

- Lectures, seminar discussions, presentations, group projects on social change in China
- Chinese language classes provided on most days

Eligibility

- Undergraduate and graduate students at one of the participating Ontario universities who are returning to full-time studies after this program

Scholarships

- \$2,000 OJS scholarship
- Must be Canadian citizen or permanent resident to be eligible

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Intensive Mandarin Course

For students with basic Mandarin to improve their language capacity

Timing

- Four weeks, mid May—mid June*

Language competence

- Basic to mid-level Mandarin

Partner Institution

- Nanjing University of the Arts, Nanjing

Course fee

- About 3,600 RMB/person (about CAD\$720)
- Accommodation 1,600 RMB/person (about CAD\$320, double-room with A/C and bathroom)

Program Overview

- Intensive Chinese: Students will be placed at appropriate level based on testing. One-to-one language partner
- Weekly cultural activities and visits: art exhibitions, paper-cutting, calligraphy, painting, clay sculpture, and Tai Chi; visits may include the walls of the Ming Dynasty, the Presidential Palace, Nanjing Museum, Mausoleum of Dr. Sun Yat-sen, Brocade Museum and Nanjing Massacre Memorial



Scholarships

- \$2,000 OJS scholarship
- Must be Canadian citizen or permanent resident to be eligible

- Undergraduate and graduate students at one of the participating Ontario universities who are returning to full-time studies after this program

Chinese Language & Culture Program

Learn Mandarin and experience first-hand the spectacular culture of China!

Timing

- Four weeks in July*

Language competence

- No knowledge of Mandarin required

Partner institution

- Yangzhou University, Yangzhou

Course fee

- Program fee about 3400RMB/person (about CAD\$680)
- Accommodation about 1400RMB/person (about CAD\$280, double room with air-conditioning and bathroom)

Program Overview

- Survival Chinese: Based on students' language proficiency, to improve their listening, speaking, reading and writing skills
- Cultural activities and visits: Chinese traditional culture such as paper-cutting, calligraphy, painting, clay sculpture, Tai Chi and Peking Opera with a view to helping students appreciate the unique charm of Chinese culture; visits including Slender West Lake, Ge Garden, He Garden, Daming Temple and Yangzhou Museum

Summer Design School

Interdisciplinary practice for design students to create a unique cultural experience of Chinese culture

Timing

- June 17—July 14 (tentative dates)*

Language competence

- No knowledge of Mandarin required

Partner Institution

- Jiangnan University, Wuxi

Course fee

- Program fee about USD\$2000 /person, all-inclusive except return airfare

Program Overview

- The Summer Design School is designed to create an interdisciplinary practice for design students from various backgrounds, to explore the different emerging issues along with new technologies and services, and to create a unique cultural experience of the traditional and the new cultures in China.
- Part I: Public Art Practice, a two-week short course that explores the crafts and traditions of the local ceramics and sculptures, as well as how public art pieces integrate into the modern city
- Part II: The application of service design tools and methods to address a social problem or an emerging issue.
